Dear Parent/Carer,

The penultimate week of the Autumn term has seen the festive fun continue with the children enjoying the various activities and opportunities including Christmas jumper day, lip sync, karaoke and sweets from Santa for the top pledge point earners from the previous week.

Our Year 11 children had their mock results assembly where they were all given an envelope to open which contained their results to mirror what will happen with the real results in the summer. As always, this is a hugely important assembly which provides validation to the students who have been working hard as well providing an important reality check for those that may not have been fully applying themselves up until this point. As I said to the children in the assembly, there is still time to make a significant difference to their grades prior to the second round of mock examinations in March and indeed the real examinations in the summer. The most important part of this process is reflecting on the strengths and areas for development identified from the mock papers for each subject.

The progress league has also been updated, and it was great to see the Year 11s all swarming around the board to see their position and how many places they have moved up since the end of Year 10. A big well done to the top five students in the league with Abishek M in fifth, Matas B in fourth, Milly E in third, Danylo P in second and Tyler S leading the way.
