Dear Parent/Carer,

As January draws to a close we have had another busy week in and around the school with lots to write home about.

Mr Baria led assemblies for all year groups which focused on the British Value of Tolerance. He talked broadly about diversity in terms of race, religion, languages spoken at home and then went on to talk about the importance of not just tolerating but celebrating diversity. Mr Baria invited volunteers to come to the front of assembly and participate in an activity called Step Forward, Step Together where students were asked a series of questions which demonstrated the diversity even in small groups of students, but that diversity is what we celebrate when we all unite and say 'We are Montsaye.'

Also on Monday, our fantastic sports leaders were back in action as they led a KS2 Archery Event. This was another fantastic opportunity for them to develop their leadership skills and show the wider community how talented our young leaders are. It also served as a reminder that all people should use their voice to speak out against prejudice and prevent other genocides from taking place.

Our Year 11 food students spent part of the week completing their NEA practical assessments where they each cooked a number of dishes from scratch with the grades contributing toward their final GCSE grade. It was great to have so many of them wanting to come and tell me what they had made and how proud they were of the final dishes – I'm hoping these saved parents and carers from cooking at least one night this week!
